Attachment Theory



Our introductory course is aimed at anyone who works with children, from social care workers to teachers, and wants to understand attachment theory.

Understanding Domestic Abuse Training



This course covers a wide range of information and guidance for all those working with individuals, both child and adult, who are vulnerable to domestic abuse or suffering from it. The modules in this product have been created with victims in mind and will inform learners about domestic violence, and how to

E-Safety



This course describes the various forms of abuse and danger caused by the use of technology and the internet, both for adults and children, and gives detailed information on how to counter its effects. You will be able to identify adults and children at risk, what forms online abuse takes and how to recognise them, and information on how to help and protect adults and children.

Child and Adult Sexual Exploitation



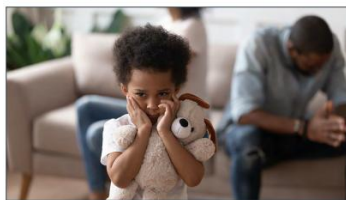
This course provides information on dealing with both Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) and Adult Sexual Exploitation (ASE). Aimed at those who work with vulnerable individuals, it includes guidance on grooming, trafficking, consent and reporting.

Fabricated Illness



Fabricated Induced Illness (FI) is a rare form of child abuse that can often go unnoticed. This course describes the symptoms of FI and the risk factors that can lead to it, and includes case studies, guidance for practitioners. It will help those healthcare workers and those working with children to be more aware of FI.

Child Poverty



Anyone working with children and families may be exposed to children in poverty. Being able to identify children in poverty is a crucial step to help them and their families out of poverty and support them in the future. The modules in this course provides information on the potential causes of poverty, how to help children and their families, guidance on multi-agency working and the learners roles and responsibilities as a practitioner.

FGM (abuse linked to Faith or Belief)



This course covers FGM (female genital mutilation), abuse linked to faith or belief, and forced marriage. This course help learners to understand the links between these issues, provides information on how to identify vulnerable people, and how to report and act on such knowledge.

LGBTQ+ Awareness



This training is designed to give learners a much deeper understanding of the key issues facing LGBTQ workers and how to ensure that they are safeguarded in the workplace. Upon completion of this course learners will be able to create an inclusive environment for all employees through their policies and procedures.

Level 3 Safeguarding Children



Anyone who requires Level 3 Safeguarding Training has a considerable responsibility for safeguarding children and they have to be able to act accordingly to information and concerns brought to them.

Safeguarding in Sport



Ensuring you understand your roles and responsibilities in protecting children in a sporting environment is crucial for anyone who works with children. It's essential that anyone who may come into contact with children has up-to-date safeguarding knowledge and can identify the signs and symptoms of abuse or neglect.

Child Criminal Exploitation, Gangs and County Lines



This course describes how children and young people can be vulnerable to gang related issues, Child Criminal Exploitation (CCE), and the definition of 'county lines'. You will be able to identify the signs of children and young people at risk and what forms gang related issues can take. The course gives information on how to report and act to protect those at risk or already involved in these issues.

Radicalisation and Extremism



This training course will help learners to understand various forms of radicalisation and extremism and how it can be recognised and countered. This course also looks into further steps and organisations to contact if they suspect someone is being radicalised.

Safeguarding in Education



Anyone working in education has a responsibility to ensure children are safeguarded from potential abuse or neglect and it is a requirement that staff have up-to-date knowledge of safeguarding policies, legislation and guidance. Staff need to be able to recognise any of the signs or symptoms of abuse and how to report them to the correct authority.

Safer Recruitment



This Safer Recruitment course teaches key points in protecting children in care focusing on key aspects such as best practice in safe recruitment, methods of vetting and safety precautions.

Modern Slavery and Trafficking



Modern slavery and trafficking are two of the most important safeguarding topics for anyone working with vulnerable children or adults. It is crucial that they have an in-depth knowledge of these areas and can spot the signs and symptoms of abuse.

Level 2 Safeguarding Children



This level 2 course will give learners the knowledge they need to be able to identify the signs and symptoms of abuse and what they need to do if they suspect a child is being abused or discloses sensitive information to them.

Safeguarding Children in Social Care



With this Safeguarding Children in Social Care course discover why safeguarding is important, what the indicators and warning signs of abuse and key legislation relating to safeguarding children.

Safer Working Practices



This wide-ranging course covers safer working practices for many situations that involve working with children and young people. It is increasingly important to manage your own behavior and that of children and co-workers in situations involving professionals and volunteers.

Self-Harm Awareness



Identifying and understanding self-harm and its causes, how someone could be vulnerable to self-harm, and what to do to help them, are covered in this course.

Sexual Health



Anyone working in the healthcare environment or has any safeguarding responsibilities should have an understanding of sexual health and how to promote good sexual health and behaviour. This online training course will give learners the knowledge they need to give safe and correct advice for any sexual health concerns.

Suicidal Thoughts



Identifying and understanding suicidal thoughts, how they develop and how you can support someone who has them, are explained in this course. Someone with suicidal thoughts will have a poor mental state and will not be able to cope with life as normal, this course shows how to identify and support this poor mental state.

Understanding the Impacts of the Trio of Vulnerabilities



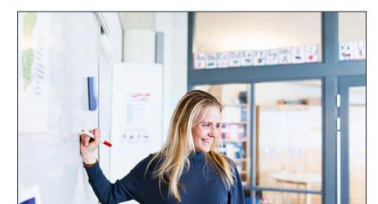
The Toxic Trio of domestic abuse, parental mental ill-health and parental substance abuse – can have a severe impact on vulnerable children and young people, and the parents themselves. Understanding Professional Boundaries



Explore with this Understanding Professional Boundaries course how to understand why we need boundaries, understand 'best practice' with regards to professional boundaries and understand the need for clear limits relating to professional boundaries

Understanding the impacts of hate crime



This course guides the learner to identify what hate crime is, how to identify hate crime and hate incidents, and what to do next. It covers the background using real life cases as illustrations, the definition, reporting, the role of the bystander and witnesses and ways you can prevent hate crime.

Understanding the Importance of Court Skills for Children's Social Workers



This course is designed for all those working with children and young people who are attending court or involved with legal processes that could result in court attendance. It will help to give learners the skills to successfully negotiate these complex situations.

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Understanding the Importance of Primary behaviour support



This course, designed for those working with children and young people in an educational environment, after taking the course you will be able to; identify strategies for promoting positive behaviour in schools, understand the role of Primary Behaviour Support Teams in schools and identify the types of support available.

Understanding Young Minds



This Talking to your children about emotional resilience and self-harm course handles the subject of teenage self-harm and parental ways to support your children, in a sensitive and informational way.

Safeguarding in Children's Workforce



This course introduces safeguarding, its importance when working with children and the many associated skills and knowledge required. Anyone working with children needs to ensure they have an appropriate level of safeguarding training in order to satisfy their safeguarding responsibilities.

Learning from Serious Case Reviews Levels 1 to 4



This Learning from SCR course will equip all those who come into contact with children with the knowledge and understanding they need to respond to neglect, abuse and extra-familiar harm to help prevent future serious child safeguarding incidents.

Safer Sleeping for Babies



Greater awareness of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) is one of the most effective ways to reduce cases. This course is designed to do just that whilst ensuring learners gain knowledge on practical and effective ways to reduce the risks.

Supporting Teenagers and Young People



This course covers a wide range of information and guidance on how to support teenagers and young people who are vulnerable to relationship abuse, substance misuse, and teenage pregnancy.
