EYFS Safeguarding Requirements Strengthened from September 2025

From **September 2025**, the **Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)** statutory framework will be updated to introduce **stronger safeguarding measures** across all early years settings.

Key changes include:

- **Safer recruitment**: Providers must now obtain references and include safer recruitment procedures in safeguarding policies
- **Child absences**: Settings must follow up on prolonged absences and hold additional emergency contact details
- Safer eating: Children must be seated safely while eating, with supervision at all times.
 Providers should minimise distractions and record any choking incidents requiring intervention
- **Safeguarding training**: All practitioners must renew training every two years. A new annex outlines minimum standards for safeguarding courses.
- Paediatric First Aid (PFA): Students and trainees must have PFA training to be included in staff ratios.
- **Whistleblowing**: New requirements aim to support staff in escalating safeguarding concerns confidently.
- Privacy and toileting: Settings must balance children's privacy with safeguarding during nappy changing and toileting.

These changes are designed to enhance child safety, align with best practice, and respond to lessons learned from previous incidents.

Course structure

- Effective curriculum planning and assessment
- Supporting personal, social, and emotional development
- Understanding developmental differences
- Implementing EYFS learning and development requirements

The course aims to enable participants to be part of the Tameside and Stockport C-Card Condom Distribution Scheme

and provide information and support around sexual health to young people and young adults.

It is intended for professionals working in Tameside and Stockport who deliver direct work with young people aged 13 to 24 years and wish to deliver the Tameside and Stockport C-Card Scheme within their organisation. This includes the registration of young people onto the C-Card Scheme.

Objectives of the course are:

- To develop an understanding of the C-Card Scheme process and to be able to deliver C-Card interventions
- To be able to register young people and young adults onto the C-Card scheme which includes using the C-Card database
- To increase awareness of the types and variety of condoms, dams, femidoms, lube and other products available through the scheme
- To acquire relevant information about Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) and the screening process
- Increase participants knowledge of sexual health services and online testing, and be able to support young people to access these

GCP2 TSCP Training

Neglect affects 1 in 10 children in Tameside. GCP2 is a strengths and evidence-based assessment tool that helps professionals measure the quality of care provided by a parent or carer in meeting their child's needs. Following the training you will be able to use the tool to grade aspects of family life on a scale of one to five. This helps identify areas where the level of care children receive is good and where it could be significantly improved. By completing the training, you will be able to provide guidance and/or interventions, or signpost/refer to the most appropriate supporting agency.

If you have not yet registered, please book a place on one of the available dates on our <u>TSCP</u> website **This tool replaces TNAP**.

GCP2 is a free 1-day training course, where you will explore how the tool works and complete an assessment. On completion you will receive a GCP2 license to use the tool, as well as all the training materials needed.

TSCP Threshold Awareness Training

People who have attended these events found them to be extremely helpful and informative.

Information shared enables practitioners to gain a better understanding of how to use the document to decide which type of support and intervention may be needed to support families, to build on their strengths, while ensuring children are protected from harm.

The day provides the opportunity for professionals from all agencies to take part in practical activities, that will support how best to use the thresholds when making decisions. The PowerPoint with all the important information will be shared with everyone who attends the session.

TSCP Missing from Home Training - spaces still available

The local authority has a statutory duty to offer all children and young people, who run away or who have been reported as missing a Return Home Interview.

Whilst missing from home or care, children and young people may experience abuse in any form, use substances, or experience poor mental health and these situations could reduce the child's or young person's safety. Quite often when children and young people are missing, their education, family and social relationships, and life chances can often be hindered.

Missing children and young people are particularly vulnerable to trafficking, violent crime, drug use and exploitation, including sexual exploitation and criminal exploitation. If you are a carer or professional and would like to develop your knowledge and understanding in this area, please join us at one of our training events.

Understanding Exploitation TSCP Training - spaces still available

Safeguarding children from exploitation is everyone's business. Improve your understanding and raise your awareness about how children and young people are groomed and exploited.

Know the signs and indicators that a child or young person is at risk of or is being sexually exploited, such as sextortion and/or criminally exploited, including county lines. Develop your understanding of the impact that child exploitation has on children, young people and their families and what to do if you suspect that a child or young person is at risk and how to safeguard them from harm.

Brook Sexual Behaviours Traffic Light Tool is a tool to identify, understand and respond to sexual behaviours in children and young people up to 18 years old.

Curiosity about bodies and sex is a normal part of development. However, some sexual behaviours can be a sign of abuse or CSE (Child Sexual Exploitation). Brook's tool can help you know the difference.

This tool was originally introduced following a serious case review. It takes between 1 and 2 hours to complete and we still have plenty of licences available for all partners to access.
